

OUR FEBRUARY MOTHER'S STORY

As a Client of Marisol, Jessica was contacted by the Family Development Specialist, Becky, at her 20-week gestational date to discuss how she was feeling about and managing with her pregnancy. During the conversation, Becky noticed Jessica's somber tone of voice - a heaviness that often indicates some type of emotional struggle. When Jessica was asked about this, she stated with vulnerability that her current financial situation was causing her great anxiety. She simply was not making ends meet. Otherwise, she was happy about being pregnant and looked forward to delivering her child. Upon hearing this Becky asked Jessica if she expected friends or family to throw her a baby shower, but Jessica answered sadly that she was certain this would not be the case.

After their conversation, Becky felt prompted by the Holy Spirit to select Jessica as the February recipient of the Holy Name baby shower and would tell her at her next appointment at Marisol Health. When Jessica arrived at Marisol, her countenance reflected the same heaviness Becky had noticed weeks prior. The moment came when Jessica explained to Becky the great news about the Holy Name baby shower for which she had been selected.

Within a few moments, her expression became brighter and more radiant as she learned that she would be able to select all the baby's material needs and it would not cost her a dime. Jessica's immediate response was one of deep gratitude and utter surprise. With child-like humility she stated "this means so much to me. I am very, very, very grateful. This makes me feel more secure about having this baby knowing that the things I need are being given to me. I feel as if a heavy weight has been taken off my shoulder."

Thank you, Holy Name parishioners, for loving not just with words, but in deed and in truth. You have found a way to support the women who choose to honor the life they carry. Whether you express your love with a car seat or a diaper bag, it all adds up to the same blessing Jesus performed when he fed the multitudes that became hungry on a hillside in Galilee. We want to help you get to know more about our SVDP conference and their efforts by featuring a story from one of our neighbors in need each month.

A SVDP Story: Steve's Story

Lilah is truly one of our neighbors! She remembers cutting across our parking lot, going to and fro between her grandparents' house and Sheridan Middle School. She was baptized and confirmed at All Saints, where her grandparents were long-time parishioners. After a few rough years, she eventually graduated from Sheridan's SOAR Academy. She's now 32 and has 3 daughters (divorced from the alcoholic husband). The four of them share a bedroom in a house owned by relatives – both sides of this arrangement are hoping she will find adequate housing. Meanwhile, Lilah spends most of her days caring for an elderly aunt. There is no compensation - it's just that this is her aunt and she needs the help. Lilah forgot that three years ago she put her name on a list for housing with Archdiocesan Housing. Imagine her surprise when she got the call – that her name had come up, and a 4-bedroom townhome would be available February 1. She only had \$450 to put toward the \$1800 move-in costs. With your donations and contributions from the St Vincent de Paul Society at Light of the World and Our Lady, Mother of the Church, we were able to make the \$1,350 payment. Another blessing: this house will have a bedroom for her elderly aunt. Mother, daughters, aunt - all are happy to finally be together in a place they can call their own.
