Dear friends,

FROM FR. DANIEL

We have begun a new Lenten season. The very fact that we are invited every year to embrace the Lenten observances is a recognition of God's love for us and of our need for constant renewal.

Based on today's readings, we are reminded at the beginning of Lent of the sobering truth of sin. While probably none of us would deny the existence of sin, we should still examine ourselves and discern if we forget about sin or "domesticate" its presence, "getting used" to sinning in certain areas.

But sin is not part of who we are. It is part of our experience after the original fall, but we have not been created to sin. Rather, we have been given freedom to choose love and reject sin. May our meditation on sin and the temptations of Christ renew in us the awareness of the terrible reality of sin and the desire to always say no to the temptations that will be part of our path. Christ has made us free.
