FROM FR. DANIEL

Today the Lord makes clear one of the important consequences of our faith: if we believe in God then we should never worry. Do not let your hearts be troubled, says the Lord.

To be sure, the Lord did not say, “do not let your hearts suffer.” He knew that there will be difficulties along the way. The good news is not that those who follow Him will never suffer, but that if and when they do, their hearts can be free of the heavy experience of being troubled, of worrying, and losing our peace.

This new reality is a logical consequence of our faith: if God is real and powerful and loving, then He will never abandon us, and will only allow those things that can bring a greater fruit. If we believe in Christ, then we have to believe that He is near, always walking with us. If the resurrection is real, then death and sin have no longer power over Him, or over us.

May we renew our simple faith and therefore, never let our hearts be troubled.

HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE WITH CREATIO

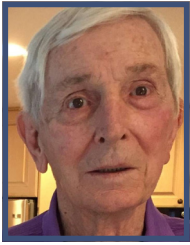
OCTOBER 22 - NOVEMBER 5

Sodalite Brother Chris Lanciotti is leading a unique Holy Land pilgrimage this fall (Oct 22-Nov 5) that will follow the steps of Christ and his disciples through the Holy Land. Pilgrims will walk approximately 100 miles from Nazareth to Jerusalem over the course of 14 days which will culminate with 3 full days in Jerusalem. The trip will be accompanied by a Fr. Kenneth Pierce of the Sodalite community. Pilgrims will have the chance to hear biblical reflections, walk, and celebrate mass at the very sites where they occurred; including Nazareth, Mt. Tabor, Nain, Jacob's Well, the River Jordan, Jerusalem and more.

SERVING THOSE IN NEED

HOLY NAME ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY SERVING OUR NEIGHBORS IN NEED

Did you know that the St. Vincent de Paul Society here at Holy Name helps our local neighbors who are facing immediate challenges? We want to help you get to know more about our SVDP conference and their efforts by featuring a story from one of our neighbors in need each month.

A Story from our SVDP Society: Bridging the Gap

Jenny and Andrew reached out to St. Vincent de Paul looking for help with their rent in December. After experiencing homelessness earlier in the year and living out of their car with two small children they'd finally saved up enough money to move into an apartment. However, when Jenny's hours were unexpectedly cut at work, they found themselves falling farther behind on bills and rent. They needed help to cover December's rent to ensure they would not face homelessness again.

St. Vincent de Paul volunteers met with the young family and were able to help cover a portion of their rent. They also provided a number of household items for the family: blankets, diapers, wipes, crib, stroller, towels, etc. With Andrew starting a new job, financial stability was on the horizon for the family. The help from St. Vincent de Paul bridged the financial gap and kept the family in their home.

There are a lot of charities that help those in need. What's so distinctive about the St Vincent de Paul Society?

The distinctive "charism" of the St. Vincent de Paul Society is that it provides person-to-person assistance to those in need, usually through a home visit. We dispense these gifts without the bureaucratic requirements of government assistance programs, in an encounter that is meant to affirm the dignity of those we meet. Rather than seeing these people as "clients," they are treated as "neighbors."
