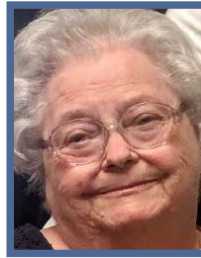

LINDA KEEFOVER

Funeral services for former parishioner Linda Keefover, age 80, will held on Friday, September 15, with a Rosary recited at 10 AM, a funeral Mass at 10:30, and committal services at Fort Logan National Cemetery at 12:00 PM. A reception in St. Agnes Center will be held at 12:30 pm.

Born on April 30, 1943, in Denver, she was baptized at St Dominics Church in north Denver. She attended St. Francis de Sales school where she received her First Communion and Confirmation. On February 1, 1963, she was married to Gerald R. Keefover at St. Anthony of Padua Church. Gerald died in April 2022; they had been married for 59 years. They had one son, Mark.

Linda was a teacher's aide in the Englewood School District. Linda was a Holy Name parishioner for 31 years, registering in January 1992. She sang in the choir and was a member of the Marthas funeral ministry. While a parishioner at All Saints Church, she taught religious education.

Dear friends in Christ,

FROM FR. DANIEL

The Lord invites us today to think about the Church. Contrary to what most people think, the Church is not just the sum of the individual believers, who gather to worship and serve. The Church is a mystery: the body of Christ in which we all find our place, as the logical consequence and condition of loving God—we love God above all things, and our neighbor as ourselves. Therefore, as St. Paul says today, Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another.

And indeed, we owe this love to the other members of the body of Christ. As a consequence of this, the Lord reminds us today that we are responsible for our brothers and sisters and that, as such, we must do everything we can when we see that sin or temptation are making progress. Fraternal correction, in any of its forms, is an expression of charity: out of love for God, we love our neighbor and thus, we help them be free of error and grow closer to God.

May these readings help us renew our gratitude for being members of the body of Christ, and our joyful commitment to practice charity with all.

A FEW NOTES ON EVANGELIZATION

WHAT EVANGELIZATION IS:

- inviting others to know, love, and follow Christ.
- an occasion for relationship. Invest in those around you, intentionally spend time together, show them that you hear them, know them, love them.
- a time to be selfless. Having difficult conversations about the faith or inviting people to Mass or other events at the church may seem intimidating or uncomfortable, but by challenging yourself and those you love, you are answering God's call and providing an occasion for conversion.
- an invitation to belong to a joyful, beautiful community of friends.

WHAT EVANGELIZATION IS NOT:

- someone else's job. There is no physical way that bishops, priests, and Church employees can personally evangelize every person on the planet. It is your responsibility to reach out to those around you.
- something you need to force. You cannot control what someone else believes, your role is to love them and show them the truth.
- too difficult. Evangelization always begins with simple invitations and genuine friendship.
- a one-and-done deal. One conversation or invitation isn't enough, you'll need to follow-up and continue your friendship.

Don't know where to start?

Start in prayer! Ask the Lord who he is calling you to reach out to. Pray for them, spend time with them, and consider inviting them to events at the parish, such as Oktoberfest! This event is one of the best opportunities for evangelization because we provide great food and drink, a fun, youthful atmosphere, and a community full of joyful friends.

WHAT OKTOBERFEST IS:

- a fun event with homebrew beer, German-style food, and live music.
- an opportunity to bring to the church friends, family members, neighbors, coworkers who aren't practicing the faith, without the intimidation of other kinds of invitations.
- a time to meet new people, spend time in conversation, and appreciate the joy of belonging to a vibrant community.

WHAT OKTOBERFEST IS NOT:

- an event for Catholics from all around Denver. They come anyway, but the idea is for you to invite non-Catholics or non-practicing Catholics.
- simply a social event. Rather, Oktoberfest is an intentional outreach event, created for evangelization. If you don't have someone to invite, this can be a great occasion to volunteer, and help by setting up, tearing down, or serving during the event.
