#### FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

- The last Financial Report shared with the parish was for Fiscal Year 2022, ending June 30, 2022.
- Cash deposits and investments continue to be maintained, meeting an Archdiocese requirement for an emergency fund of 6 months operating expenses.
- Offertory gifts: Parish donations increased 10% from FY22 to FY223
- Holy Name continues to use Faith Direct as our online giving platform. Online gifts continue to increase. At the end of June, we had 160 offertory donors, with a weekly average of \$6,940 (monthly average of \$30,701) thru Faith Direct accounts. Monthly service fees are \$341.25, an increase of \$16.25 from FY22. Average monthly credit card fees incurred are \$660, and ACH (checking/savings accounts) fees are \$80. We received an average of \$170 per month to help offset processing fees from donors.
- In FY23, Holy Name paid monthly assessments to the Archdiocese of:
  - Parish Fee: \$4,926, Support of Catholic Schools: \$4,184, Seeds of Hope: \$337
- Other receipts for FY23 include: ACA Rebates of \$53,965, and Parish Hall Rental Income of \$17,282.

- (1) In FY23, offertory increased over 10%. For the budget, Holy Name anticipates more donors contributing thru The Catholic Foundation or other Donor Advised Funds (DAVs)
- (2) After setting up a Savings Trust account with the Archdiocese, Holy Name is earning over \$1,000/month in interest
- (3) Holy Name received one large one-time grant in FY22. We are not anticipating receiving that grant again.
  Donations from DAVs are included here.
- (4) This campaign is over. No longer needed for budgetary purposes.
- (5) At the end of FY23, Holy Name received a large gift. We did not anticipate any church renovations before submitting the budget to the Archdiocese, therefore the budgeted numbers are low.
- (6) The Unrestricted Capital Income fund is no longer necessary. It was from the interest generated in the CAP Savings loan, which is now closed.
- (7) In FY23, Holy Name added one new salaried employee, along with one new priest. The budget has been adjusted for additional staffing changes, benefits, a new Colorado FAMLI Program, and pensions
- (8) The costs for votive candles have been included in this line item, it will be moved in FY24. The votive candle program pays for itself.
- (9) In FY23, Holy Name had to add office space for new employees. Minus these additions, assessments and office supplies remain steady.
- (10) Holy Name did not expense depreciation in FY22, but did in FY23, and will in FY24.
- (11) Includes Revolving Fund Savings, investment funds, and Marthas checking account.
