



## Godparent Eligibility Statement

(Each godparent must complete a separate form/sent this completed form to the Holy Name parish office.)

Congratulations on being asked to be a godparent. By accepting this responsibility, you are committing to play a significant role in this person's spiritual life, sharing the faith and encouraging him/her in his/her journey as a Catholic. Being a godparent is not just an honor given to a relative or good friend; it implies a real appreciation of the Catholic faith and the desire to pass on the practice of the faith to the person to be baptized. Persons who do not attend Mass regularly or are living in marriages not recognized by the Church or are cohabitating outside of a Catholic marriage or who are Christians but not Catholic may not be qualified to serve as godparents. Please complete a Baptism Preparation Class at your parish prior to the scheduled baptism, or you may complete the online course prescribed by Holy Name Catholic Parish. Please take this completed form to your parish to have it signed and sealed by the pastor, deacon, or their representative.

*The Church's Code of Canon Law sets the requirements to be a godparent. Godparents must be mature, faithful, and practicing Catholics who have received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist) and who lead a life in conformance with the Catholic faith. (See Canons 872, 873, 874 and 893)*
